Soil-related regulations in the UK

England:

- The Farming Rules for Water (2018): Created to achieve compliance with the WFD, and were transposed into domestic Diffuse Pollution legislation in 2018.
- <u>CAP cross-compliance rules (GAEC 4, 5, 6)</u>: Require farmers to achieve minimum soil cover, minimise soil erosion and maintain the level of organic matter in soil.

Wales:

- The Water Resources (Control of Agricultural Pollution) (Wales) Regulations 2021 (currently under review): Seek to address agricultural pollution and classify the whole of Wales as a nitrate vulnerable zone (NVZ).
- <u>CAP cross-compliance rules (GAEC 4, 5, 6)</u>: Require farmers to achieve minimum soil cover, minimise soil erosion and maintain the level of organic matter in soil.

Scotland:

- <u>The Water Environment (Controlled Activities) (Scotland) Regulations 2011</u>: Tackle diffuse agricultural pollution and were created to comply with the WFD.
- <u>CAP cross-compliance rules (GAEC 4, 5, 6):</u> Require farmers to achieve minimum soil cover, minimise soil erosion and maintain the level of organic matter in soil.

Northern Ireland:

- <u>The Water Environment (Water Framework Directive) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2017</u>: Transpose the WFD.
- <u>CAP cross-compliance rules (GAEC 4, 5, 6)</u>: Require farmers to achieve minimum soil cover, minimise soil erosion and maintain the level of organic matter in soil.
